

Re: Request to amend County Jeff Ordinance No. 2021-12

Judge Robinson *et al*:

Previously we requested that the Jefferson County Quorum Court consider in its March meeting, pursuant to ordinance no. 2020-164 and 2021-12 as amended, that certain employment positions within the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office be considered exempt from the hiring freeze instituted by said ordinances. Our requests were placed on the Public Safety Committee agenda for the committee meeting held on March 2, 2021 but were subsequently pulled on the night of the meeting for reasons that remain unclear. We respectfully request that this matter be placed on the agenda as an item for the April 2021 Public Safety Committee meeting.

Jefferson County Ordinance No. 2021-12 institutes a hiring freeze of all positions of county employment notwithstanding those that are specifically exempted in Article I. Certainly, a reasonable person would agree that the positions already described as exempt from the hiring freeze in Article I are immensely important to the services provided by Jefferson County to the public. However, we contend that the current exemptions fall short in identifying some positions that are critical to the effective operations and/or in meeting the constitutional duties of our office. Within our various facilities and budgets, there are positions that we assert are critical to health & safety, are necessary to satisfy a legal mandate (standards, rules, and regulations), are necessary for efficient and cost-effective operation, and/or funded by either a grant or other dedicated revenue source.

We respectfully request that Jefferson County Ordinance No. 2021-12 Article I be amended to include an additional subsection that states:

(8) maintenance, maintenance supervisor, cook, part-time cook, cook supervisor, registered nurse, part-time nurse, teacher, paraprofessional, bookkeeper and/or clerk within the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, W.C. "Dub" Brassell Adult Detention Center (DBDC), Jack Jones Juvenile Justice Center (JJC), and Juvenile Education.

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The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office including all of its facilities operates 24/7. Maintenance of these facilities as they age is a unique and daunting undertaking. DBDC is now 13 years old, while JJC is nearing its 24th year in operation. These facilities house detainees who quite honestly have at times accelerated the aging process. Our maintenance personnel are most often challenged with repair projects and daily upkeep that in size and frequency would not be cost effective to call a local tradesman to remedy on a case-by-case basis. Keeping the facilities in as functional and clean as possible condition is paramount to the health and safety of the detainees as well as to the employees who work therein. Neglecting a detention facility's maintenance, even for a short time, will compound problems such as the potential for an escape or for harm to come to a detainee or employee, leading ultimately to litigation against our county.

When it comes to cooking, I am required through DBDC food services staff to provide three (3) meals daily to all detainees that meet specific dietetic/nutritional guidelines prescribed in Arkansas Jail Standards. Many detainees are on "special" diets due to health, medical, or religious reasons of which each must be accommodated. Currently, the DBDC is housing approximately 200 detainees, while JJC is housing approximately 28 on a daily basis. Post Covid these numbers are expected to rise. Even one meal missed is grounds for 42 U.S. Code § federal civil rights law suit.

According to Arkansas Jail Standards and under the Eighth Amendment to the United States Constitution, detention and correctional officials are required to provide detainees who are confined with "reasonably adequate" medical care as "services" at a level reasonably commensurate with modern medical science and of a quality acceptable within prudent professional standards. If care is so cursory as to amount to no treatment at all may constitute deliberate indifference as well as cruel and usual punishment. Denial of adequate medical care is one of the top accusations of 42 U.S. Code § 1983 lawsuits across the State of Arkansas and the nation.

When a school aged child is detained they are required and it is appropriate to continue their education. Failure to attend school is a common situation with the youth who find themselves incarcerated. Therefore, we take advantage through the education program within our juvenile justice center to remedy that. JJC educators and paraprofessional staff has led many juveniles to attain their GED during confinement. Often these juveniles do not have the same oversight at home to ensure their education success, while they are in the "free world". Our education staff are funded through the State of Arkansas Department of Education.

Clerks are tasked with clerical, legal, and secretarial functions such as but certainly not limited to maintaining crime mapping, ACIC/NCIC validations, sex offender registry, warrants files, civil process records, reports, statistical reporting, serving customers and much, much, more. In the absence of clerks, we would have to call in certified law enforcement officers from serving the community and responding to crimes and/or emergencies in order to perform these duties.

The Southeast Arkansas Regional Solid Waste Management District finds that recycling glass, plastic, cans, paper and other materials will reduce the state's reliance upon landfills. Additionally, other solid waste reduction activities will help reduce the state's dependence on landfills: using waste items as raw materials in a production process, using waste items to produce an end product without recycling, using waste items as fuel and/or other activities as approved by the Southeast Arkansas Regional Solid Waste Management Board. Solid waste reduction activities mean other activities that divert materials from landfills for reuse, including all of the above without limitation. Waste stream reduction activities also curb littering, illegal dumping and abate the environmental risks caused by current solid waste practices.

Projects eligible for grant assistance include, without limitation, costs for:

- solid waste management planning that integrates recycling;
- public information and education programs that encourage waste reduction and stimulate demand for products produced from recycled materials;
- waste transfer facilities and equipment that integrates recycling in their operation;

- other waste stream reduction activities that divert the flow of materials away from landfills to be put to beneficial use;
- activities that support a recycling system including without limitation operation, construction, logistical systems and equipment; and
- Administrative costs for operation of the district recycling activities, not to exceed 25% of the district's total allocation.
